Glossary of Terms

Potential Section 106 4(f) Property – A property that may be subject to regulation under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) of 1966 and Section 4(f) of the U.S. Department of Transportation Act.

Inactive Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Sites – A former leaking underground storage tank site for which the Bureau of Underground Storage Tank Regulations (BUSTR) has issued a “no further action” designation.

ODNR Water Wells – Private water wells identified following a review of information made available through the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) Division of Water Resources.

Streams/Rivers – Mapped streams and rivers as identified in the statewide hydrography data layer provided through the State of Ohio.

Ohio Historic Inventory Properties – A structure that is 50 years old or greater that is recorded with the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO)

Ohio EPA Stream Corridor Management Zone – The surface and subsurface area within stream corridor where the management of activities is warranted due to the potential for drinking water contamination.

Floodway – The channel of a river or other watercourse and the adjacent land areas that must be reserved to discharge the base flood without increasing water surface elevations more than a designated height.

100-Year Floodplain – The land adjacent to a stream or watercourse where there is a 1% chance of experiencing a flood in any given year as defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

500-Year Floodplain - The land adjacent to a stream or watercourse where there is a 0.2% chance of experiencing a flood in any given year as defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

National Wetland Inventory (NWI) Features – Wetland features included in a geospatial dataset developed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) that provides information on the abundance, characteristics, and distribution wetlands.

Scenic Rivers 1000 ft. Buffer – The regulated buffer established by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) Scenic Rivers Program. All publicly funded projects to be constructed within a Scenic Rivers Buffer are subject to ODNR review and approval.

Noise Sensitive Area (NSA) – An area containing multiple noise sensitive receptors (i.e. residential properties, hotels, parks and recreational areas, cemeteries, hospitals, schools, etc.) for which the impacts of traffic, rail and construction noise must be considered.
