

Hills Miller Sidewalk Improvement

Revised April 20, 2020

Project Background

The purpose of the project is to provide pedestrian connectivity from the existing, large residential developments on the south side of Hills Miller Rd (in the Bruce Road area) to the new commercial development at the intersection of US 23 and Hills Miller Road. The City received several requests for safe pedestrian access to the new Speedway project once it was completed and opened.

Improvements

Continuation of the 5-foot wide concrete sidewalk along the north side of Hills Miller Road from the west end of the Speedway property to Bruce Road where the path crosses the street at the intersection and then continues to Oakhurst Drive. The project is roughly 700 feet in length and will include a pedestrian crossing of Hills Miller Road at Bruce Road. A rectangular rapid flashing beacon (RRFB) will be installed at this crossing as a safety enhancement.

Schedule & Status

The sidewalk portion of the project will start construction in the early Spring of 2020 and should be complete within 2 weeks of starting work. The RRFB will be installed later in 2020.

Project Funding

The project is partially funded by a significant contribution to the Project Trust Fund on behalf of recent development activity in the area including Speedway and the McDonald's commercial projects. Both projects were required to make contributions toward improving pedestrian access in the area. In total \$55,000 have been contributed through recent land development activity. The balance of project cost will be funded through the City's Capital Improvements fund with local tax dollars.
