Police Capt. Graduates First in Executive Leadership Class

DELAWARE – City of Delaware Police Department Captain Adam Moore graduated first in his class from the Certified Law Enforcement Executive program.

Moore this month was one of 29 who graduated at the Ohio State Highway Patrol Training Academy in Columbus. He received special recognition for having achieved the highest academic score in his class for the 14-month program.

Graduates completed study in a variety of law enforcement and leadership modules, including ethics; interpersonal skills; strategic planning; risk management and resource allocation and budgeting. The course is co-sponsored by the Law Enforcement Foundation, Inc. and the Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police.

Moore has been with the Delaware Police Department since 2002 and was promoted to Captain in 2012. During his DPD career, he has served as a patrol officer, school resource officer and detective. Moore earned a degree in Criminology/Sociology from the Ohio State University.

“This is a tremendous accomplishment for Adam and for our city,” Police Chief Bruce Pijanowski said. “Professional development benefits not only the individual but also the agency in which they work and practice, and their community.”

The Delaware Police Department is the City’s largest, with approximately 60 employees, including 54 sworn officers.
